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GENERAL INFORMATION & USEFUL ADDRESSES

CALLING FINLAND AND PHONES

- Country code: +358 (the first zero in area code or mobile phone number should be left out)
- Making international calls from Finland: dial 00 or + before the country code.

PHONES

- Public phones are rarely found in Finland as the vast majority uses mobile phones.
- If you have a mobile phone, you can buy a Prepaid-SIM card, which allows you to make phone calls and send text messages. You can also use the card to make international calls and send text messages to international numbers, although there may be restrictions as not all mobile phone operators have a mutual contract.
- Prepaid-phone cards (phone operators DNA and Kolumbus) are sold widely in for example **R-kioskis**, small kiosks that sell some basic groceries, magazines, newspapers and rent DVDs. The current prices vary between 7,50€-15€. Please see the shop listing below for the addresses.

STARTING PACKAGE

- Most TYS-residents have been reserved a Starting Package which includes basic household items (pillow, a blanket, curtains, a cooking pot, a sharp cutting knife, a dinner plate, a soup plate, a glass, a mug, cooking items (spatula or ladle), a knife, a fork, a spoon, a teaspoon, and a can opener.
- All of the items are to be returned in the same condition upon departure.

COMPUTER FACILITIES

- The Computing Centre (ATK-keskus) and helpdesk are located at Educarium building (Assistentinkatu 5) on the 4th floor. Take the lift next to the library to the 4th floor, the helpdesk is on the right-hand side of the lift. You can contact the helpdesk in case you have problems related to computers. The Summer School staff and tutors are also happy to help you to use the University network.
- As International Summer School students you will receive a username and password which allow you to access the Internet from university computers, as well as to use the public, wireless Internet broadband network, SparkNet, on your own laptop on campus.
- You will have unlimited access to a computer laboratory (ATK-luokka) around the clock, also on the weekends. The computer laboratory is located in the Educarium building next to Publicum, on the 3rd floor. When entering the building through the smaller door next to the library, take the lift to the 3rd floor. When exiting the lift, turn left to the computer lab. In order to enter the computer lab and the building outside office hours, you need an electronic key, which you will receive at Computing Center's (ATK-keskus) helpdesk. Formal ID must be presented in order to receive the electronic key. The fee of the electronic key is included in the Summer School fees. Please remember to return the key before you leave!

FOOD AND DRINK

There is a variety of restaurants and cafés in Turku. Lunch offers often include salad, a main course and tea/coffee, for appx.6€/10€. Lunch hours depend on the restaurant, but are generally between 11.00/12.00 and 13.00/15.00.

SPORTS & OTHER ACTIVITIES IN THE STUDENT VILLAGE

There are tennis, basketball and volleyball courts as well as two miniature golf courses in the Student Village.

Turku Castle, Linnankatu 80 (C5)

The Castle of Turku and the City of Turku Historical Museum form a historical treasury with their various exhibitions.

Luostarinmäki Handicrafts Museum, Vartiovuorenkatu 4 (F4) (Luostarinmäki)

The fascinating museum displays old city buildings from 200 years ago, old handicraft professions and craftsmens' living conditions.



Wäinö Aaltonen Museum of Art, Itäinen Rantakatu 38 (E4)

In addition to quality-laden exhibitions, the City's art museum offers concerts, lectures and various kinds of events.

Turku Art Museum, Aurakatu 26 (E3)

Turku Art Museum has returned from Vartiovuori to Puolalanmäki to the renovated museum facility, where visitors can enjoy the museum's valuable collections and varying exhibitions.

Aboa Vetus & Ars Nova, Itäinen Rantakatu 4-6 (E4)

The archaeological-historical museum called Aboa Vetus displays the quarters of medieval Turku that have been buried underground. Ars Nova is a modern art museum.

Forum Marinum, Linnankatu 72 (D5)

The national marine and navy history museum and marine centre, which museum ship fleet includes the bark Sigyn, frigate Suomen Joutsen (Swan of Finland) and the mine boat Keihässalmi.

Kuralan Kylämäki, Jaanintie 45, outside the map, follow Hämeentie (G3), turn right after KKK-Supermarket

Kuralan Kylämäki village is the City's museum of living history, where visitors can experience the daily life of the people of Southwestern Finland in the 1940's and 1950's.

Pharmacy Museum and Qwensel House, Läntinen Rantakatu 13 (D4)

The Qwensel House built in the 16th century is the oldest bourgeoisie housing from the self-sufficient period that has survived completely through time. A pharmacy from the 17th century has been furnished in the shop wing of the building. A charming café is located in the Pharmacy Museum's inner courtyard and it is open at 10-16. Go and meet cafés own cock Iisakki!

Biological Museum, Neitsytpolku 1 (E4)

An interesting nature museum that has 13 different nature sceneries with animals on display.

Liedon Vanhalinna – The ancient castle area in Lieto

Old manor, situated near an ancient fortified hill in Lieto (5 km from Turku), is nowadays a museum and cultural center. You can visit rooms of the manor as well as three exhibitions: (1) archaeological findings from the area and two ethnographical exhibitions presenting (2) formation and interaction of the cultures in Scandinavia-Baltic-Russia area and (3) the "Thread of Life" exhibiton.. 1.8 – 16.8.2009 museum and the cafeteria are open Tue - Sun at 11-18. Entrance € 4.20. Free entrance on Lieto Day on Sun 28.8.2009 (open 13-16).

Turku Cathedral

Turku Cathedral (F3) is regarded as Finland's most valuable monument of architectural history. The construction took place in stages up to the first decades of the 19th century. The greatest changes in appearance happened in the 15th and 16th centuries. Most of the present interior dates back to the restoration after the Great Fire of Turku (1827). Next to the Cathedral is a Dom Café open at summertime Mon-Fri at 11-18, Sat-Sun 11-16.

Turku Cathedral Museum, Tuomiokirkkotori 20

The museum presents the history of the cathedral and ecclesiastic life in the national sanctuary of Finland.



Michael's Church (D4)

Michael's Church, designed by Lars Sonck, dominates the view on the western side of Turku. This 100-year-old church, much loved by locals, is built in the German Jugendstil style. The construction of the building was completed in 1905.

St. Henrik's Ecumenic Art Chapel

An interesting piece of Finnish architecture in Hirvensalo app. 30 minutes from city center by bus number 54 (direct line from the Student Village, in Market Square leaves from Eerikinkatu, in front of Hansakortteli Shopping Centre). There is also a beach nearby.

Tuorla Observatory

Tuorla Observatory and the Space Research Laboratory together form the Väisälä Institute for Space Physics and Astronomy (VISPA) at the University of Turku. Tuorla Observatory is the leading astronomical institute in Finland in many areas of astronomical research. The Observatory also has a café and a lunch restaurant, as well as a store that sells products manufactured at the Countryside College of Southwest Finland.

NATURE AND OUTDOORS IN TURKU

KUPITTAANPUISTO PARK (F4-G4)

This is where local people go for a picnic or play football or frisbee with friends. Finland's oldest and largest city park includes e.g. an outdoor swimming pool, a bird garden, activities for children and two restaurants.

RUISSALO

Ruissalo is an island located about 8 km from Turku Center. Ruissalo offers a great chance to see a bit of the wonderful Finnish nature, very near the city! On 18 August at 15.30 Mr. Lassi Suominen, a biologist, will give Summer School students a Nature Walk in Ruissalo.

The habitants of Turku often go to Ruissalo to swim or just walk around the beautiful area with fields and old wooden houses. The Botanic Garden of the University of Turku is also situated in Ruissalo.



You can get to Ruissalo by bus, boat or bike. There are also Minicruises with the ferry m/s Ruissalo, which operates between Martinsilta Bridge in the city centre and Kansanpuisto park. The ferry has a small café, and on the way you will see Turku Castle and a brand new view of the harbour from the sea. A return trip costs 10€, one-way trip 6€. (When you are taking you bicycle along, be prepared to cost 1€ extra.)

The City of Turku owns three islands for outdoor recreation: Vepsä, Maisaari and Pähkinäinen. The inhabitants of the city and travellers may relax on these islands.

VEPSÄ - THE ISLAND OF SMUGGLERS

The steep rocks in the middle of the island of Vepsä have in the past provided a cover for sailors who were caught in the storms of Airisto. The rocks have also been a sheltered hiding place for smugglers.

The island of Vepsä is an excellent day trip destination, because there is a lot to do for both small and older children. There is a nice safe beach, two saunas, boats and canoes for rent, and equipment for outdoor and indoor games on the island. Vepsä is also a terrific place for families to rent a cabin and to organise larger camps. The island's holiday cabins made of timber and the ridge-roofed cottages offer accommodation for 90 persons.

MAISAARI - THE HERITAGE OF PEASANT SAILORS

Maisaari has a long history of peasant sailing. At least 11 masters and one farmer's wife are known for having sailed their cutters regularly from the 16th century until the middle of the 19th century to Stockholm to sell their peasant products.

Maisaari is an old archipelago estate in the archipelago of Rymättylä. The main buildings of the island, Isotalo and Antola, and three warm cabins offer comfortable accommodation for 30 persons. In Isotalo there is a kiosk and a fireplace room with a TV and a small library, as well as a play corner for children. There are premises for meetings and negotiations and accommodation in the house of Antola.

PÄHKINÄINEN - THE ISLAND OF HAZEL BUSHES AND HORSES

Fabritius, a veterinarian from Turku who was known for being an eager horseman, built the main building of Pähkinäinen in 1923 for the association Turun hippos. The island of Pähkinäinen became a real summer paradise for horses. Every spring the boat Klaara was loaded with a flock of lucky horses from Turku to run free on the summer stamping grounds of Pähkinäinen.



Pähkinäinen has received its name from its vegetation. The island has a magnificent flora of verdant hazel bushes and a leaf tree grove, as well as rugged rocky shores. In addition to a large natural conservation area, there are nowadays excellent fishing grounds and a beach with clear water. The island's guest harbour is located in a sheltered cove of the bay. There is accommodation for 3-12 persons in rooms for two, four and six persons in Pähkinäinen. In addition, there are a beach sauna and a summer cafeteria on the island.

THE ARCHIPELAGO TRAIL

The scenic route around the Turku Archipelago takes you through stunning nature and cultural landscapes. The route covers about 250 kilometres, travels through some 10 archipelago municipalities, crosses 12 bridges and makes nine ferry crossings. By car you can finish the Trail in a day – but why hurry in such a beautiful place? Consider taking the trip by bicycle. Stop at beaches, museums and nature trails.

There are plenty of accommodation options along the route, which are marked with brown signs.

THE SMALL ARCHIPELAGO TRAIL: NAGU (NAUVO)– SJÄLÖ (SEILI)–HANKA

The Small Archipelago Trail is the name for the route that goes straight from Nagu to Hanka in Rymättylä via the beautiful and historic Island of Själo (Seili). The ferry trip takes about an hour in all, but you can get off on the Island of Själo and wait for the next boat. The distance between Hanka and the village of Rymättylä is 15 kilometres.
