CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR DOCTORAL RESEARCHER POSITIONS AT THE UNIVERSITY OF TURKU GRADUATE SCHOOL, JUNO DOCTORAL PROGRAMME

1 Doctoral Programme at the Faculty of Humanities: JUNO

Juno is an interdisciplinary doctoral programme that combines historical approach, cultural analysis and critical art studies. It educates specialists in cultural change bringing together 16 fields of research.

Juno offers qualified international doctoral training providing the candidates an ability to work both independently and in team, to produce new critical knowledge and communicate its results effectively to various audiences.

Juno graduates can build their careers as researchers and educators, specialists in cultural management, in memory organisations like museums and archives or work among scholarly publishing and editing field.

2 Application period and what can be applied for

During the application period 1 March–17 March 2023 the JUNO Doctoral Programme invites applications for **the right to study for a doctoral degree at the University of Turku. The study right begins on August 1, 2023.**

Who may apply

2.1 The right to study for a doctoral degree at the Faculty of Humanities, University of Turku can be applied for by

Persons who meet the eligibility criteria for pursuing a doctoral degree as stipulated in the Universities Act (558/2009, Section 37), may apply for the right to pursue the doctoral degree at the Faculty of Humanities, University of Turku. The general prerequisite for the right to complete postgraduate studies is a Master's degree or an equivalent higher university degree. Applicants must hold an applicable higher university degree or must have completed an applicable education abroad which, in the country in question, qualifies the student for postgraduate studies equivalent to those offered at the University of Turku, or must be able to otherwise demonstrate the knowledge and readiness needed for scientific postgraduate studies. A degree or other form of education will be considered relevant if the work is of a high standard, includes advanced studies (or equivalent), and is in a field that adequately prepares the candidate for conducting the research proposed in the dissertation plan/preliminary research plan.

3 Applying

Application documents

The right to study for a doctoral degree is applied for by filling in an electronic form and attaching the required additional documents. [A link to the electronic form will be published on](#)

[the website of the graduate school](#). The form will be accessible as the application period begins on 1 March 2023 and closes at 11:59 pm (local time in Finland) on 17 March 2023. All of the required attachments must be submitted before the end of the application period. Applications that arrive after the application period has ended will not be processed. The application documents will not be returned to the sender.

Assessment of applications

Applications which arrive in time and meet the criteria for the Doctoral Programme will be evaluated by the Steering committee of the programme. The evaluation will take into consideration the quality of the research plan, the feasibility of the plan, the motivation and the statement of the major subject. On the proposal of the Steering Committee the Dean will grant the right to pursue a doctoral degree.

All application documents must be written either in Finnish, Swedish or in English. The application documents will not be returned to the sender.

4 Decisions

The admission decisions are made by the end of May 2023. All applicants will be personally informed about the decision.

An admitted applicant has to notify the University of Turku of their acceptance of the study place by 3:00 pm (Finnish time) on 15 June 2023 according to the instructions given in the admission notification. If the admitted applicant does not give the notification by the end of the allotted time period mentioned above, the applicant forfeits the study place. A person admitted to more than one university or polytechnic degree programme only notifies the one educational institution at which they choose to accept the study place. Notification, i.e. accepting a study place, is binding and may not be cancelled or changed later.

According to Finnish university legislation, an applicant may accept only one study place leading to a higher education degree in Finland during one academic term (autumn term 1 Aug – 31 Dec or spring term 1 Jan – 31 Jul). This rule applies to all higher education, i.e. Bachelor's and Master's level degrees awarded by Finnish universities of applied sciences, Bachelor's and Master's degrees awarded by Finnish universities, and Licentiate and Doctoral degrees awarded by Finnish universities. This regulation is not applied to study rights received in transfer student selections, from the Åland University of Applied Sciences, from the Police University College, and from institutions of higher education outside Finland.

The applicants who have completed their prior degree in a country other than Finland and who are granted a study right in this call, need to deliver either the original degree certificates or certified copies of the original degree certificates and their translations to the University of Turku, as instructed in the admission notification, on 15 September 2023 at the latest. If the admitted applicant does not deliver the required certificates by the deadline, they forfeit the study right. Instructions on delivering certificates and country-specific requirements.

5 Appeal for rectification

If an applicant is dissatisfied with the result of the student selection (right to study for a doctoral degree), they have the right to submit an application for the rectification of the decision to the Faculty of Humanities within 14 days of the official publishing of the results. 6 Application Documents

The application consists of an electronic form and required documents. Applicants should prepare the following documents and attach them to the electronic application form as PDF files. Please read the lists below carefully. (Recommended length should not be exceeded.)

1. **Research plan** (max 5 pages, for guidelines see: <https://www.utu.fi/en/university/faculty-of-humanities/doctoral-training/how-to-apply> ->Research Plan
By attaching the research plan to the application form, the applicant gives permission to check the research plan with *Turnitin OriginalityCheck* software (a system for electronic plagiarism detection).
2. **An abstract of the applicant's Master's thesis** (or equivalent) or a summary of other scientific publication activities
3. **Letter of motivation**
Motivation letter is one page long freeform document, which includes the reasons for applying for the doctoral studies at the University of Turku.
4. **Degree certificates and transcripts of study records**

A. If the applicant has completed the former degree(s), which make them eligible for doctoral studies at a university in Finland, the scanned degree certificates, the transcripts of study records and other educational documents, which may be of relevance in the student selection must be attached to the electronic application form.

B. If the applicant has completed the former degree(s), which make them eligible for doctoral studies at a university abroad (i.e. outside Finland), they must attach the following items to the electronic application form:

- scanned original degree certificates (in the language that the degree was completed in)
- scanned original transcripts of study records (in the language that the degree was completed in)
- scanned other original educational documents which may be of relevance in the student selection and that you are applying based on.

If the original degree certificates or transcripts of study records are not written in English, Finnish or Swedish, official translations to one of these languages must also be submitted. An official translation here refers to a translation of the educational documents issued by the awarding institution and a translation made by an authorised translator. A transcript in English can be replaced by a Diploma Supplement (DS) awarded by a European educational institution, provided that it contains the information about completed courses and other study attainments.

Please make sure that all attachments are good-quality, easy to read, full colour scans or photographs of the complete required document. Attachments that do not meet these requirements may be rejected.

Those applicants who have been granted a right to study and who have completed their prior degree abroad have to submit either the original degree certificates or certified copies of the

degree certificates and other educational documents and the official translations of the documents to the University of Turku as instructed in the admission notification by 15 September 2023 at the latest. If the admitted applicant does not deliver the required certificates by the deadline, they forfeit the study right. 5. Verification of language proficiency

The University of Turku follows the Rector's decision (15 Aug 2019) on the means of verifying one's language proficiency. [See the language requirements on the webpage of the university's graduate school.](#)

Applicants that are required to prove language proficiency with a language test, must attach a scanned certificate of a completed language test to the application.

6. Statement of the major subject

The applicant must ask for a statement concerning their application from the professor in charge of postgraduate studies at the department (major subject) they wish to join. A positive statement in which two supervisors are named by the professor in charge of doctoral studies in the major subject is a prerequisite. Without a positive statement, the application will not be taken into consideration. The professor is asked to send the statement directly to the faculty, [humpostgraduate\(at\)utu.fi](mailto:humpostgraduate(at)utu.fi), by the end of the application period.

7.

SUPERVISION

Well before submitting the application (usually for at least a month before), the applicant must contact the department/major subject that most closely corresponds to their research interests and agree on a preliminary research plan and study plan as well as on the arrangements concerning the supervision of the future doctoral dissertation.
