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► Introduction from Director

The year 2020 was a difficult one for everyone as the Covid-19 pandemic took hold and “normal” life was turned upside down. The academic world suffered the same disruptions as the rest of the world, but also had ones of its own. In particular one of the great joys of academic life – the interaction and debate with colleagues at seminars, colloquia, conferences and the like – was severely disrupted as events were either moved online or cancelled. In TIAS our research carried on and, to paraphrase Marx, we continued to make history, but hardly under circumstances of our own choosing.

One result of the disruption is that there is no doubt that this report is somewhat thinner than it would have been in a “normal” year. Put simply, Covid meant that less activity happened. Yet, we survived and can even look forward with some optimism. No one knows what the “new normal” will be like, but we *do* know that TIAS and its Fellows will continue to engage with the world and play their role in trying to shape it. In the “new normal” the sort of interdisciplinary research which TIAS seeks to foster will be more vital than ever. If the pandemic sometimes forced us to consider the value of our research, then in the longer term that value will reassert itself in new ways. In the TIAS report for 2019 I wrote of my ‘hope that Institutes for Advanced Studies, including our own, can play an important role in helping to build the post-virus world’ and that remains a fervent hope and aspiration.

The fact that, despite Covid, TIAS entered 2021 in good shape is due to a lot of hard work by people to whom thanks are due. First amongst these are the TIAS Fellows who tirelessly pursue their projects, producing new knowledge and challenging conventions. I am once again impressed by the strength of their work as academics and by the great humanity which they have shown during these difficult days. My thanks to them and to their host departments. The TIAS Board of Management continues to support the Institute’s work in a highly collegial way and I would like to thank them for that. The Chair of the Board, Jaakko Suominen, has been particularly helpful and is due special thanks. Our Co-ordinator, Jenni Kankaanpää, has continued to serve TIAS in a thoroughly professional and thoughtful way. I have been particularly grateful for her continued support in this difficult year and there is no doubt that she played a key role in keeping TIAS functioning throughout 2020. Once again, my sincere thanks to her.

TIAS also benefitted from the work of Georges Kazan who joined us as a temporary Senior Research Fellow working on a number of development projects. This included a successful bid to the Academy of Finland for funding to stage three workshops with our colleagues in the Swedish Collegium for Advanced Studies and Aarhus Institute for Advanced Studies, which will take place in 2021 and 2022. Georges also prepared a number of other funding bids and provided constant support for TIAS' development. Many thanks to him.

In 2020 we were also delighted to welcome Professor Ulrika Maude of the University of Bristol as Visiting Professor in Mentoring. This role has been developed in order to enhance the continuing professional development of our Fellows through the provision of both general and bespoke mentoring support. Ulrika has acted as a "critical friend" to our Fellows and has already helped a number of them in project development. My thanks to her. This work is aligned to the general mentoring programme at the University which our Fellows have benefitted from and I would like to thank all those involved in this programme.

As I write these words, I am reminded once again of TIAS' many strengths. This report provides just a little insight in to the contributions which TIAS makes to both the University of Turku and to wider society. It also allows us to look forward to the future with renewed confidence. Our work continues and we look forward to making more contributions in the years ahead.

TIAS is always delighted to work with colleagues within and beyond the University of Turku. Our door is always open to new ideas and potential collaborations. We hope that you find this report enjoyable and informative and we look forward to hearing from you.

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► TIAS Mission and Profile

Founded in 2008, Turku Institute for Advanced Studies (TIAS) works across the faculties of Economics, Education, Humanities, Law and Social Science to foster internationally excellent interdisciplinary research. TIAS is a joint enterprise between the faculties of Education; Humanities, Law, and Social Sciences and the Turku School of Economics.

TIAS funds its Fellows to undertake three-year research projects. The Fellows represent two different career stages: postdoctoral and mid-career (collegium). Postdoctoral Fellows are able to advance their professional competence after recently being awarded their doctorates. Collegium Fellows have the opportunity to develop the competence required for more demanding research posts or other expert positions after the postdoctoral period. In addition to their salary, TIAS Fellows receive €3 200 per annum towards their research costs.

TIAS Fellows are selected via an international competition. In spring 2020 we held a Call for 5 postdoctoral Fellows to join us from January 2021. This resulted in 296 applications and the successful applicants were announced in September 2020 (see the website of TIAS).

In 2020 the TIAS research community consisted of 38 Fellows: 17 Collegium Fellows and 21 Postdoctoral Fellows. In addition to Fellows, TIAS staff in 2020 comprised of the Director: Professor Martin Cloonan; Co-ordinator: Dr Jenni Kankaanpää, Controller: Heli Kaarlela, Senior Research Fellow: Georges Kazan and Visiting Professor in Mentoring: Ulrika Maude.

The Institute holds regular meetings for its Fellows, providing the opportunity for them to interact with one another and present their work in a collegial and interdisciplinary environment. In 2020 Fellows presented on a diverse range of topics and discussed topics such as Learning When to Say No in Academia, Sustainability and Research Careers.

In addition to supporting its Fellows in their projects via the provision of research allowances and continuing professional development activities, TIAS also hosts a range of events designed to appeal across disciplinary boundaries. In 2020 these activities were disrupted by Covid, but will hopefully resume more fully in 2021.
