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## ► Introduction from Director

There can be no doubt that 2021 was another difficult year for TIAS as the Covid-19 pandemic continued to wreak havoc amongst academic and wider life. The report you have in front of you is, like the 2020 one, a somewhat thinner document than would have been the case in a “normal” year. Covid continued to restrain our activities and hampered the building and maintenance of the sort of collegial research community which TIAS aspires to be. But we survived and can look forward to another year with some optimism.

Perhaps the highlights of life in TIAS in 2021 were less the academic jousting of normal years than the chance to socialise. We were not able to gather in person as much as we would have wanted, but we still managed an excellent picnic in Turku’s Linnanpuisto in June and a fine pikkujoulu (Christmas party) event at Turku’s Villa Järvelä sauna complex in December. The chance to meet and socialise with colleagues on both occasions was much appreciated. Our other face-to-face interactions were less frequent, but also treasured.

Of course, academic life continued. We managed to hold a mixture of in-person, hybrid and online events and these saw the usual amount of interdisciplinary excellence with which TIAS is associated. Papers were still published, conference still attended (even if mainly virtually), media appearances made and impact produced. Our Fellows continue to be at the forefront of their disciplines and to produce outstanding work. Many thanks are due to them for that.

I would also like to thank our Coordinator, Jenni Kankaanpää, for once again supporting TIAS excellently and ensuring that we ran smoothly and efficiently. The TIAS Board, and especially its chair, Jaakko Suominen, continued to offer great support and thanks are also due to them. Our Visiting Professor in Mentoring, Ulrika Maude, again went way beyond the call of duty in helping our Fellows and the wider university community with their career development. Senior Research Fellow Georges Kazan continued to work on research bids and the development of strategy and thanks are due to him for his dedication and hard work.

That hard work was rewarded in December when we received 290 000 € from the Kone Foundation to develop more work with the Scholars at Risk (SAR) network ([www.scholarsatrisk.org](http://www.scholarsatrisk.org)). This will include provision of a postdoctoral fellowship for one scholar from 2022-2025. Georges wrote the excellent bid which led to this award and it remains heartwarming that TIAS can be involved in SAR activities.

We began our series of workshops entitled “Beyond Advanced Studies” in Uppsala in November funded by the Joint Committee for Nordic research councils in the Humanities and Social Sciences (NOS-HS) following a bid submitted by Georges. Working with our colleagues from the Swedish Collegium for Advanced Study and the Aarhus Institute of Advanced Studies, this series of three workshops examines issues related to interdisciplinarity, research careers and the role of Nordic Institutes for Advanced Studies in fostering both. We are delighted to be leading developments here and are looking forward to closer cooperation with our Nordic colleagues in the forthcoming years.

So, whilst this report looks back there is also much to look forward to. For 2022 we are planning more events and looking forward to participating in the University’s Research Assessment Exercise. We welcome the opportunity to collaborate with colleagues from within and beyond the University and continue to look forward to hearing from you.

## ► TIAS Mission and Profile

Founded in 2008, Turku Institute for Advanced Studies (TIAS) works across the faculties of Economics, Education, Humanities, Law and Social Science to foster internationally excellent interdisciplinary research. TIAS is a joint enterprise between the faculties of Education; Humanities, Law, and Social Sciences and the Turku School of Economics.

TIAS funds its Fellows to undertake three-year research projects. The Fellows represent two different career stages: postdoctoral and mid-career (collegium). Postdoctoral Fellows are able to advance their professional competence after recently being awarded their doctorates. Collegium Fellows have the opportunity to develop the competence required for more demanding research posts or other expert positions after the postdoctoral period. In addition to their salary, TIAS Fellows receive 3 400 € per annum towards their research costs.

TIAS Fellows are selected via an international competition. In spring 2021 we held a Call for 4 collegium and 3 postdoctoral Fellows to join us from January 2022. This resulted in 314 applications and the successful applicants were announced in September 2021. This Call saw one position in each category reserved for applicants dealing with the issue of sustainability. This was also the last Call for candidates to start their TIAS Fellowships in January. A second Call was open from November 2021 to January 2022, with four positions in each category and applicants due to start in September 2022. The results are set to be announced in June 2022.

In 2021 the TIAS research community consisted of 27 Fellows: 11 Collegium Fellows and 16 Postdoctoral Fellows. In addition to Fellows, TIAS staff in 2021 comprised of the Director: Professor Martin Cloonan; Co-ordinator: Dr Jenni Kankaanpää, Controller: Heli Kaarlela, Senior Research Fellow: Georges Kazan and Visiting Professor in Mentoring: Ulrika Maude.

The Institute holds regular meetings for its Fellows, providing them with the opportunity to interact with one another and present their work in a collegial environment which traverses disciplinary boundaries. In 2021 Fellows presented on a diverse range of topics such as medieval polemics, the animal holocaust and supply chain management.

In addition to supporting its Fellows in their projects via the provision of research allowances and continuing professional development activities, TIAS also hosts a range of events designed to appeal across disciplinary boundaries. In 2021 these activities were disrupted by Covid, but will hopefully resume more fully in 2022. Amongst our external speakers in 2021 were Tom Dark, Senior Commissioning Editor for Manchester University Press. We also held another grant-writing workshop where grants in progress were subjected to peer review. In addition TIAS, together with Turku Collegium for Science, Medicine and Technology, held its third lecture series in the City of Turku Main Library in autumn 2021. See page 13 below for details.

### **23 April 2021: Enlightenment Symposium**

The Enlightenment was a multi-faceted socio-politico-philosophical enterprise that peaked in the 1700s and brought about all kinds of societal and political reforms. Many of its fundamental ideas still flourish and are constitutive of modern society. These ideas include – but are not limited to – freedom of speech, freedom of religion, individualism of citizens, egalitarianism, economic and political liberalism, and the more general idea of harnessing rational and well-informed thinking to the development of local, national and global community. At the same time, it may seem that many of these ideas are also being questioned today. Perhaps it is not too far-fetched to say that irrationality and thoughtlessness or even superstition-like attitudes are gaining ground. Does this mean that the ideals of the Enlightenment have come under threat?

### **4 June 2021: Sustainability and Academic Research**

The UN Agenda 2030 for Sustainable Development aims at eradicating extreme poverty and hunger, and ensuring sustainable development which takes the environment, people and the economy into account. The values and goals of Agenda 2030 are also recognisable as drivers of academic research. Wellbeing, solidarity and equality, prosperous and stable societies and a healthy environment are common ideals for the sciences and scholarship across disciplines.

On the eve of World Environment Day, researchers representing diverse fields gathered together to discuss their academic work in the context of sustainable development and Agenda 2030. Faced with a multitude of challenges ranging from the COVID-19 pandemic and global environmental crisis to a variety of risks pointed out by for example the third citizens' panel on sustainable development in Finland, the presenters and audience were invited to share their thoughts and insights on sustainability and academic research.

The event was organised by in conjunction with our colleagues in Turku Collegium for Science, Medicine and Technology (TCSMT) and the University's Cultural Memory and Social Change Network. Following the network's socio-cultural thematics, the event paid special attention to the social and cultural aspects of sustainability. ### TIAS Alumni

The number of TIAS alumni now stands at 96, of which a third are currently either full or associate professors. The TIAS Alumni Network (TAN) will be developed further in 2022 as it is now able to meet in person again.

### International Activity

The Covid pandemic again severely limited international activity. Our Fellows were largely unable to undertake international research visits and the majority of international conferences were held online. We were also unable to invite scholars to undertake research visits to TIAS as part of our Visiting Scholars programme. This provision has resumed in 2022 and at the time of writing, two Visiting Scholars have already visited TIAS. We hope to expand this number later in 2022.

### Scholars at Risk

Scholars at Risk (SAR, [www.scholarsatrisk.org](http://www.scholarsatrisk.org)) is an international network which seeks to support scholars facing repression in their home countries and to support academic freedom. Since 2018 TIAS has been leading SAR activities in the University. Work in 2021 included chairing the SAR Finland network, the hosting the first SAR Finland Day in November and receiving 290 000 € from the Kone Foundation in December to support the development of more SAR work. TIAS will seek to develop more SAR activities in 2022.
