"German texts, by virtue of their digressiveness, are versatile and multi-faceted, whereas Anglo-Saxon writing is repetitive and colourless. Equally, German text structure might be likened metaphorically to that of a 'staircase' or 'spiral' leading the writer through even more complex stages of reasoning to the conclusion. Viewed from this perspective, English academic style will appear like a walk over a perfectly flat country with no attempt to venture into mountainous territory."





Deceptive paraphrase

(Allows you to rewrite your work to fix problems)



Sarah E. Parkinson and Orkideh Behrouzan are writing about the refugee-crisis in the Middle-Eastern countries in their article "Negotiating health and life: Syrian refugees and the politics of access in Lebanon" which has been published in October 2015 as a part of a release called Social science & medicine.

One of the main points in the article was that the conflicts that are ongoing in Syria, Lebanon, Iraq and Yemen make it crucial to focus on fostering the understanding between health, violence and everyday life in the Middle East and North Africa. The evidence that has been gathered from participant observation among Syrian and Palestinian refugees in Lebanon has shown that the procedures like refugee registration or insurance contracting may actually hinder or discourage refugees from accessing healthcare services and
