

- National Sauna Association has published instructions on the <u>right sauna etiquette</u>.






Ice Cream lovers

Academic community


- Students are not considered customers but equal members of the academic community > easiness in approaching the staff (office hours!)






THE VIVID AND COSY STUDENT CITY TURKU



Academic freedom and responsibility

- Freedom to make decisions on your studies (timetables, minors, the interest of research)
- Responsibility of the progress of your studies
- Basic rights guaranteed by administration: objectivity, lawfulness, equality
- No insurance provided by the university for students (exception: e.g. lab work, field course)



Academic year

Autumn Semester

- 1 August 31 December
- Periods I and II
- Teaching ends around 20.12.

Spring Semester

- 1 January July 31
- Periods III and IV
- Teaching starts around 10.1. and ends in April/May (may vary between faculties)

No official Summer Semester, but some courses or exams can be taken during summer.



Credits

- 1 credit (cr) = 1 opintopiste (op) = 1 ECTS
- 1 ECTS = 27 hours of work
 - (including lectures, seminars, reading, writing, and independent work)
- The recommended workload for one Academic year equals to 60 ECTS
 - 30 ECTS during one semester.

Peppi & Personal Study Plan (PSP)

- <u>student.peppi.utu.fi</u> → Accessed with your UTU account.
- Peppi is the most essential system for students in their studies.
 - Used to create and update your personal study plan (PSP), enroll to courses and non-electronic exams, examine your completed studies, and update your contact information.
- Instructions on how to use Peppi, how to enroll on courses (and when to do that), and how to create your PSP should be offered by your degree programme staff.
 - You have coordinators, study advisors and academic/teacher tutors for this purpose.
 - Most likely they will e-mail you with information and/or offer it at their degree programme orientation session.
- If your degree programme does not discuss these topics with you at the latest during your degree programme's orientation session
 → E-mail them and ask for assistance.
