EC2U: A Master's Degree Programme in European Languages, Cultures and Societies in Contact

This international master's degree programme (120ECTS) trains language professionals for a multilingual and multicultural world. It is part of the EC2U Alliance (European Campus of City-Universities) and means close co-operation between the universities of Turku (Finland), Poitiers (France), Jena (Germany), Pavia (Italy), Coimbra (Portugal), Salamanca (Spain) and Iasi (Roumainia). During your studies, you will spend at least two exchange semesters at one or more of the EC2U partner universities. After completing the programme, you will be awarded a Master's degree by all the universities where you studied for a minimum of 30 ECTS.

The master's programme provides you with an interdisciplinary theoretical framework, embracing the fields of linguistics, culture and society from the perspective of diversity. It prepares you for a future career as an expert in European languages, language diversity and culture, and prepares you to work for local, national and international bodies, or to conduct high-profile research in language and culturally related topics across Europe.
