Learning outcome: The doctoral candidate recognises the differences between

scientific and journalistic forms of expression and what are the ethical challenges as an expert in Social Media. The doctoral candidate can take account of the media's viewpoint, and apply that in their media communication. The doctoral candidate acknowledges what the social responsibility of researcher means when communicating with

public audience.

The doctoral candidates will write a press release on their research topic that will raise media interest and lead to a news story, or TV or radio interview. The doctoral candidate will practice the interview skills as an expert and how to describe their research in an ethical manner for the general

public.

Credits: 5 ECTS

Learning methods: The course includes workshop exercises, dialogical lectures,

and independent writing exercises.

Literature: Lecture materials.


