

About the study programme

- The Master's Degree Programme in Inequalities, Interventions and New Welfare State is a cross-disciplinary, international study programme for the Academy of Finland flagship project INVEST.
- It is the only Finnish research flagship in social and behavioural sciences, and utilises its world-class social and behavioural scientists for teaching and supervising students.
- Includes projects from Social Policy, Demography, Sociology, Psychology and Child Psychology. This makes the programme unique both in Finland as well as in Europe at large.

Aim of the programme

- Students are expected to acquire knowledge and insight of:
 - The key socioeconomic and demographic changes in societies linked with social inequalities
 - The role of welfare state institutions and services in compensating and/or enforcing these in different country contexts
 - A high level quantitative methodological skills for analysing data on such issues.





Structure of INVEST programme (2020-2022 Curriculum)

- Prerequisite Courses 5 ects
- Language Studies 9 ects
- Subject Studies and Research
 100 ects
 - including advanced methods 10 ects
- Elective Studies 11-16 ects





Study Time

- 2 academic years
- Academic year runs from 1 August until 31 July
- Semester dates:
 - Autumn semester: 1 August -31December
 - Spring semester: 1 January 31 July
- Teaching is organized between
 - September and mid-December in Autumn
 - January and mid-May in spring



DEMARCATION OF STUDY TIME

- The targeted completion time for a Master's degree is two academic years
- Possibility to register as nonattending if studies are interrupted
- Students must submit the thesis and course assignments in time in order to get enough credits and to graduate in time





Career opportunities

- The INVEST Master's Programme educates research and public administration professionals
- There is a strong emphasis in developing students quantitative research skills
- Typical areas of employment include:
 - Public administration
 - Research focused public and private institutions
 - Academia
 - Data science

- The electronic application is open from 5th to 19th of January 2022
- Note that application time is informed in Finnish time

General admission criteria:

- you have a nationally recognized first cycle degree – typically a Bachelor's degree – from an accredited institution of higher education
- your degree corresponds to at least 180 ECTS (European credits) or to three years of full-time study
- your degree gives eligibility to master level studies in the country where it was issued
- You have excellent English language skills and a certificate that proves those skills.





Programme specific eligibility

- All applicants must have at least a Bachelor's degree in applicable fields of social and behavioural sciences.
- The content of previous studies should be similar/related to the INVEST project. For example:
 - social inequality
 - comparative social research
 - child and youth development
 - welfare state services, benefits, and policy processes
 - population and family demographics
 - prevention and intervention research and quantitative methodological courses (e.g. STATA skills)
 - other related studies



Student selection

- The eligible applications will be scored based on:
 - their previous studies and work experience (0 to max. 30 points)
 - and the letter of motivation (6 to max. 15 points), with a maximum of 45 points achievable.



Tuition fees and scholarhips

- Scholarships are available for student subject to tuition fees
- The scholarships are awarded based on academic merits.
- Applying for a scholarship is simple: just indicate "yes" to the appropriate question on your online application form for the programme.
- All applicants who have applied for the scholarships will receive information of the decisions in their admission offer.



Enrollment

- In order to enroll in the programme you must first confirm your study place at studyinfo.fi.
- Please note that you can accept only one study place leading to a higher education degree in Finland per semester. The choice you make is binding.
- Also notice that if you do not accept the study place within the deadline you forfeit your right to enroll in the programme.
