Features of Circular Economy

- "From linear to circular"
- Includes recycling, recovering, remanufacturing, repairing, re-designing and reusing
- Life cycle thinking
- Resource transformation
- ► Includes economic, environmental and social aspects
- Quadruple Helix as developing platform



Potential and drivers of CE

- ► Drivers:
 - ► Climate change
 - Scarcity of resources
 - ▶ Urbanisation
 - ► Biodiversity loss
 - Pollution and contamination

- Waste management
- Rising environmental concern of people
- ► Political pressures
- Critics to existing economic model

Potential and drivers of CE

- ► Lot of expectations:
 - perfect material flow and production cycles,
 - ▶ industrial renewal,
 - decoupling of economic growth from environmental damage,
 - from consumers to prosumers for service co-creation,

- waste reduction,
- shift to renewable energy production,
- elimination of the use of toxic chemicals.
- ETC.



General challenges of CE

- ► A lot of expectations how to answer?
- ► Economic growth paradigm remains often unquestioned
- How we can achieve win-win situation for the environment and the economy in practise?
- Business benefits are emphasized but how about the wider perspective of sustainability improvement? How to take into account not only economic and technological aspects? Societal and cultural approach? Citizen participation?
- Environmental risks and operational obstacles in formation of new resource cycles.



Views of companies in Turku region on CE obstacles

- Resource ownership who owns the possible CE resources and material
- Existing legislation and regulation
- ▶ Lack of promotive legislation
- ► Competitive tendering does not include CE requirements
- ► Lack of competence of political decision makers
- Slow political decision-making



Views of companies 2

- ► Values, ways of thinking
- ► Lack of good practises and routines
- ► National CE goals hard to put into practise
- ► Lack of CE leadership and management
- Problems of side stream functionality and reliability
- ► Change resistance in organisations, path dependency

How to overcome the challenges?

- ► In regions:
 - ► Taking part to regional CE networks, following and assessing information and communication in them. Knowledge management improvement
 - ▶ Developing CE business parks
 - ► Taking into account the need of different types of enterprises
 - ► Holistic and systemic approach towards CE
 - ► Quadruple helix development



How to overcome the challenges?

- 1. Rethinking the ownership: developing sharing platforms and smoother use of them
- 2. Developing different producer-ownership pilot models and assessment of the experiences
- 3. Improvement of products, longer life-cycles by creative and smart planning
- 4. Making sustainability goals of CE better known, widening the goals to all production
- 5. Improvement and foresight of the awareness of value chances and systemic changes
