Bachelor's Degree Programme in Early Childhood Teacher Education (Rauma) Bachelor of Arts (Education) (3 years)

- aims at educating education experts in early childhood, which comprises education, teaching and care to support every child's wellbeing, balanced development, and learning.
- Qualification to an early childhood education teacher and preprimary education teacher in Finland



Degree Programme in Primary Teacher Education, BA (Rauma) and MA (Turku), Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts (Education) (3 + 2 years)

- the aim is to educate well-qualified academic professionals, active future makers, critical and ethically responsible experts and researchers in the educational field.
- Qualification to a primary and preprimary education teachers in Finland (taking into account the required knowledge of languages) and other countries that recognize the Finnish teacher qualification.

The students admitted to the Degree Programme in Primary Teacher Education are granted the study right for both, the Bachelor's degree programme and the Master's degree programme in Primary Teacher Education. After completing the Bachelor's degree, the student is automatically entitled to continue studies in the Master's degree programme in Turku campus.

After completing the Bachelor's Degree Programme in Early Childhood Teacher Education, students may apply for Master's degree studies in educational sciences.



Flourishing and Healthy Learning Communities, 6 ECTS

Learning outcomes

The students

- understand the fundamental principles defining functional and wellrounded education and teaching communities
- are aware of the responsible role of the teacher as well as the entire early childhood/basic education in creating a well-rounded day care/school operating culture from the perspective of children/pupils and teachers.

Content

- The teacher's role in supporting the child's/pupil's development, learning and schooling
- The pupils' learning challenges and identifying them
- The criteria for the teacher's multiprofessional competence
- Operating culture in a diverse group of children/class and day care centre/school
- Development and learning of children/pupils from the perspective of well-being
- Growth and development path of children/pupils and their transitions
- Emotional and mental health skills of children/pupils

Study methods: Implementation Individual and/or co-operative learning assignments, presentations and essays, lectures 4 h, group work 12 h, seminar 8 h, independent group work 14 h, independent work 124 h **Evaluation criteria**: Assessment 0-5 (including self-assessment, peer assessment and teacher assessment)



Practical trainings

At the core of a teacher's work lies the understanding and supporting of a child's and group's development. The dialogue between theory and practice takes place particularly during teaching practice periods, which offer a holistic view of a teacher's work.



Rauma Teacher Training School and Early Childhood and Teacher Education Centre belong to the Rauma Campus as an important part of the teacher training of the University of Turku.

- Rauma Teacher Training School is a comprehensive school that teaches pupils in basic education from grades 1 to 9.
- Early Childhood Education Centre Rauman pikkunorssi provides researchbased early childhood education and pre-primary education for 105 children.


