► TIAS Mission and Profile

Founded in 2008, Turku Institute for Advanced Studies (TIAS) works across the faculties of Economics, Education, Humanities, Law and Social Sciences to foster internationally excellent interdisciplinary research. TIAS is a joint enterprise between the faculties of Education; Humanities, Law, and Social Sciences and the Turku School of Economics.

TIAS funds early and mid-career researchers to undertake three-year research projects. In addition to their salary, TIAS researchers receive 3000 euros per annum towards their research costs. TIAS researchers are selected via an international competition. Between February and April 2018, we held a Call for 22 new researchers to start in 2019 and 2020 (11 in each year). This Call attracted 684 applicants from 78 different countries (see page 6 for further details). Following the Call, in 2019 TIAS will be home to 36 researchers (up from 10 in 2008).

The researchers represent two different career stages: postdoctoral and mid-career (collegium). Postdoctoral researchers are able to advance their professional competence after recently being awarded their doctorates. Collegium Researchers have the opportunity to develop the competence required for more demanding research posts or other expert positions after the postdoctoral period.

In 2018 the TIAS research community consisted of 27 researchers, 10 Collegium Researchers and 17 Postdoctoral Researchers. In addition to researchers, TIAS staff in 2018 comprised of the Director, Professor Martin Cloonan; Co-Ordinators, Dr Marko Ahteensuu (January–September) and Jenni Kankaanpää (September–December); and Controllers Terhi Oinonen (January–September) and Jarmo Järvinen (September–December).

As well as supporting its researchers in their projects (including via the provision of research allowances and continuing professional development activities), TIAS facilitates the provision of a range of events designed to appeal across disciplinary boundaries. The Institute holds regular meetings for its researchers, providing the opportunity for them to meet one another and present their work in a collegial and multidisciplinary environment. In 2018 researchers presented on a diverse range of topics which included: feminism and the media; regulating new health technologies, emotions and moral agency; and governing wicked problems. Presentations from University of Turku speakers covered areas such as book publishing, open access and collaborative working. Outside speakers presented topics such as applying for research funds, reviewing and dealing with the media.

TIAS hosted a range of symposiums and conferences open to members of the public. Please see page 9 below for details.

► TIAS Call 2018

In February 2018, TIAS issued a Call for new researchers to join the Institute. The positions open were 6 Collegium and 5 Postdoctoral, to commence in each of the years 2019 and 2020. Thus a total of 22 positions were advertised. The advertisement of these positions attracted an unprecedented response. A total of 684 applications were received, with applicants coming from 78 Different countries. 122 applications were sent to external reviewers, with two reviewers commenting on each application. The reviews were then ranked and in September 2018 the TIAS Board of Management made appointed the successful candidates.
