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► Introduction from Director

As I write this Introduction, the coronavirus is wreaking havoc and both academic and wider life are in turmoil. There is no doubt that this casts a heavy shadow over this report. The terrible loss of life caused by the virus will leave a mark for generations and much work will need to be done in order to try and repair the damage. At such times the day-to-day machinations of academic endeavour can seem to verge on the futile. However, in the longer term it is clear that academic research can play a key role on our efforts to understand such events, cope with their aftermath and prepare for future ones. In terms of our own work as a multidisciplinary research institute, it is important to acknowledge that such major upheavals and events can only be fully understood via the sort of interdisciplinary approaches which Institutes for Advanced Studies seek to cultivate. In saying this I do not mean to underestimate the severity of the crisis caused by the virus, but to simply express the hope that Institutes for Advanced Studies, including our own, can play an important role in helping to build the post-virus world.

The world's first Institute for Advanced Studies, in Princeton USA, began its operations in 1933 - a time of crisis as the world approached the Second World War. The Princeton Institute played a key role in helping American society cope with that crisis and it has since been something of a role model for all subsequent Institutes for Advanced Studies. Princeton reminds other Institutes for Advanced Studies of the importance of promoting the sort of freedom of academic enquiry which, while it can appear to be redundant at times of crisis, is actually the foundation of human progress. The freedom to think and imagine is important and at their best Institutes for Advanced Studies facilitate such freedom and imagination.

Thus, if the virus provides one context for this report, then the development of Institutes for Advanced Studies provides another. This report provides both an opportunity to reflect on TIAS' work during 2019 and to note some of our researchers' achievements. In doing so, it also helps us to develop our future plans and to try to emulate the aspirations of Princeton's founders.

I would like to start on a personal note by expressing my thanks to Professor Marja Vauras who chaired the TIAS Board of Management from my arrival in September 2017 to the end of December 2019 and who had served on the TIAS Board since it began in 2008. During the time I worked with her Marja was a

constant source of wisdom and good judgment and I will miss those very much. I hope that she gets the time to relax now that she is no longer Chair.

In some ways 2019 was a “quiet” year for TIAS as we had already appointed new researchers for 2020 and so did not need to make a Call for new researchers to join us. However, looking back it is clear that in other ways it was an extremely busy year as we undertook a range of activities which helped to cement our reputation within and beyond Finland. While much work remains to be done, much was also achieved.

Such achievements are due to hard work by a range of people, to whom thanks are due. This is especially true of the TIAS researchers. I continue to be deeply impressed by the calibre of their work and by their dedication. It remains a real privilege to be able to call them colleagues and to work with them. So, many thanks to them. I would also like to thank the TIAS Board of Management for their continued support and commitment to the development of the Institute and to thank all the TIAS administrative staff for their hard work and contributions. In particular, the TIAS Co-ordinator, Jenni Kankaanpää, has been a constant source of support and sagacity. My sincere thanks to her.

This report provides some insight in to the contributions which TIAS makes to the University of Turku’s research profile and to wider society. It also highlights the diverse range of activities which the Institute undertakes. These include nurturing the continuing professional development of our researchers, hosting public symposia and other events, developing interdisciplinary working across the University of Turku, working with the City of Turku Main Library to host a lecture series, networking with other Finnish Institutes of Advanced Studies, forging international links - including hosting international researchers and working with the Scholars at Risk network - and working with social media.

In 2019 TIAS was invited by the University to draw up plans for the next five years of its development. We are extremely grateful for the University’s continued investment in us and are looking forward to the next stage of our development. This will include seeking external funding for a number of projects, building on the success of being part of the University’s successful bid for Academy of Finland PROFI5 funding and finding a home for the Institute. The lack of dedicated accommodation for the Institute remains a challenge for TIAS. As the University continues to develop its accommodation, we will continue to seek the sort of accommodation which will help us to become even stronger and facilitate more interdisciplinary working.

TIAS will also develop more mentoring facilities for its researchers and seek to help in the development of mentoring programmes across and beyond the University. Part of the PROF15 funding which we have received is being used to appoint a part time Professor of Mentoring. We are delighted to have been able to appoint Professor Ulrika Maude of the University of Bristol to this position and are very much looking forward to working with her.

TIAS is always delighted to work with colleagues within and beyond the University of Turku. Our door is always open to new ideas and potential collaborations. We hope that you find this report enjoyable and informative and we look forward to hearing from you.

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► TIAS Mission and Profile

Founded in 2008, Turku Institute for Advanced Studies (TIAS) works across the faculties of Economics, Education, Humanities, Law and Social Science to foster internationally excellent interdisciplinary research. TIAS is a joint enterprise between the faculties of Education; Humanities, Law, and Social Sciences and the Turku School of Economics.

TIAS funds its researchers to undertake three-year research projects. These researchers represent two different career stages: postdoctoral and mid-career (collegium). Postdoctoral researchers are able to advance their professional competence after recently being awarded their doctorates. Collegium Researchers have the opportunity to develop the competence required for more demanding research posts or other expert positions after the postdoctoral period. In addition to their salary, TIAS researchers receive €3 000 per annum towards their research costs.

TIAS researchers are selected via an international competition. In 2018 we held a Call for 11 researchers to join us in both 2019 and 2020. The final 22 selected emerged from 696 applications. In spring 2020 we held a Call for 5 postdoctoral researchers to join us from January 2021. This resulted in 296 applications and the successful applicants will be announced in September 2020.

In 2019 the TIAS research community consisted of 38 researchers: 17 Collegium Researchers and 21 Postdoctoral Researchers. In addition to researchers, TIAS staff in 2019 comprised of the Director: Professor Martin Cloonan; Co-ordinator: Dr Jenni Kankaanpää and Controller: Heli Kaarlela.

The Institute holds regular meetings for its researchers, providing the opportunity for them to interact with one another and present their work in a collegial and interdisciplinary environment. In 2019 researchers presented on a diverse range of topics which included using new technology in research, Investment facilitation and sustainable development, the European Macroeconomic Constitution, the Enlightenment, Research Ethics, researching forests and supporting learning and engagement. Presentations from outside speakers presented topics such as an introduction to the John Morton Center for North American Studies, Research Careers, Health and Wellbeing, Data Management and Yoga for Writing.

In addition to supporting its researchers in their projects via the provision of research allowances and continuing professional development activities, TIAS also hosts a range of events designed to appeal across disciplinary boundaries. In 2019 TIAS hosted a range of symposiums and conferences open to members of the public. Please see pages 12–14 below for details.

8 February: Emotions and affects – interdisciplinary perspectives

The role of emotions has gained increasing attention in the recent years across academic disciplines. Psychologists and neuroscientists have aimed to map out the behavioural implications and physiological foundations of different emotions, and philosophers have sought to define, for instance, the moral meaning of emotions such as empathy, shame and anger. Scholars have also explored the political backgrounds and consequences of emotions, thus researching how given emotions may, for instance, feed exclusionary politics whilst other emotions may lead to increased inclusion. Meanwhile, cultural theorists and anthropologists have analysed the cultural roots, variations and meanings of different emotion categories.

The newly re-found interest in emotions is thus cross- and interdisciplinary. The central questions are: What are “emotions”, and what is referred to by terms such as “love”, “disgust”, “guilt”, “fear” or “joy”? What sorts of political ideologies different categories of emotion may feed? How are emotions relevant to moral agency? What is the physiological basis of emotions? How do cultures influence emotions and vice versa? What is the relation between social media and emotions?

This seminar explored these questions with keynote speakers were Professor Antti Kauppinen (University of Helsinki), Professor Mikko Sams (Aalto University) and Professor Kaarina Nikunen (University of Tampere). 27-29 May: Remembrance, Trauma, Transmission and Experiential Learning

This interdisciplinary international symposium brought together a group of scholars, artists, activists, practitioners, experts from memorial sites and museums, and other engaged individuals to reflect on the concealed hatreds, prejudices, and normalised oppressions that are learnt through unhealed and transmitted traumas, which are perpetuated daily through seemingly harmless everyday practices. It also sought to determine how we can successfully break this pattern through systematic experiential learning.

3 October: Interdisciplinary research perspectives on human interaction

Interaction lies at the heart of human activity. What are the frames of living, learning and working in interaction both now and in the future? Bringing together scholars from various disciplines, this research seminar shared theoretical and methodological understandings of research on interaction at both the micro and macro levels. The seminar included keynote talks, hands-on workshops, a panel discussion, and a great deal of opportunities to network with co-participants. Keynote speakers were Melisa Stevanovic (University of Helsinki), Arto Laitinen (University of Tampere) and Jaakko Hilppö (University of Helsinki).

15 October: The relational turn in the social sciences: causes and consequences

The social sciences are supposed to be about studying social relations and how these relations make up us as beings in the world – and not just as beings who view the world. Yet for the most part the science part of the social sciences has been equated with scientific methods and their underlying theories that presume the social world to be more or less akin to the natural world: having entities in place and relations to be added to them as some sort of embellishments rather than as part of their very constitution. Relational social science is presuming the primacy of relations in making sense of whatever being in the world. To be is to relate. One cannot grasp the social world without considering the relations at its ground. This might sound elementary, but during this seminar four presentations considered various ways this truism has been forgotten for generations by social scientific mainstream and how it is making its come back in the contemporary scene of social research. Olli Pyyhtinen (University of Tampere), Peter Selg (TIAS) and Tero Piironen (University of Turku) presented papers and the keynote speaker was Professor Nick Crossley (University of Manchester).

24-25 October: Interdisciplinarity at the University of Turku

Over two days TIAS, hosted an event designed to evaluate the current state of interdisciplinarity at the University of Turku and to develop plans for future working. Senior members of each of TIAS's host faculties made presentations about their interdisciplinary work and workshops were held on interedisciplinary research and supervision. TIAS seeks to be at the centre of developments around interdisciplinarity at the University and the evidence gathered over these two days will feed in to future strategic developments.

31 October: Quitting (the) habit: fossil fuels, governmentality and the politics of energy dependency

This seminar examined the politics of energy dependency and, in particular questions concerning the use of oil. It began with a Guest Lecture by Professor Imre Szeman, University Research Chair and Professor of Communication Arts at the University of Waterloo. It was followed by a roundtable with Pia Ahlback (is Åbo Akademi), Olga Cielemecka (TIAS), Heikki Sirviö (University of Oulu), Tere Vaden (BIOS research unit) and Lieven Ameel (TIAS).

11-14 November: Celebrating Rainbow History Month

TIAS was delighted to be able to support a range of events celebrating Rainbow History month.

Rainbow History Month was organised in Finland for the first time in 2018. Unlike in many other countries, in Finland the LGBTQI history month has not yet been taken to the schools, from where it originated in the U.S.A. in 1994. One possible reason might be that in Finland the pedagogies for addressing sexual and gender diversity have not been in the focus when educating future teachers. To overcome some of the obstacles for addressing LGBTQ histories and related themes in Finnish schools and memory institutions, this colloquium Celebrating Rainbow History Month focused on the different ways in which queer history and lives can be integrated into the classroom and other sites of learning.

The seminar included a discussion of Queer pedagogies of Rainbow History Month with lectures held by Associate Professor Therese Quinn (Director of Museum and Exhibition Studies, University of Illinois, Chicago) and a guest

lecture from Professor Angelia Wilson (University of Manchester), organised in conjunction with the John Morton Center for North American Studies at the University of Turku.

21 and 22 November: Joint Meeting of Finnish Institutes for Advanced Studies

TIAS was delighted to host the second annual joint meeting of the Finnish Institutes for Advanced Studies in conjunction with our colleagues from Helsinki Collegium for Advanced Studies and the Institute for Advanced Social Research at the University of Tampere. In addition to providing the Institutes' researchers with the chance to find out more about each others' research, the meeting also saw presentations on the theme of migration (UBIAS theme for 2019) and included a special panel on the work of the Scholars at Risk network.

TIAS began working with SAR in 2018 and in 2019 the main work involved developing a funding application in order to finance a Scholars at Risk programme at the University of Turku. This application was part of the University of Turku's successful application for Academy of Finland PROF15 funding, the results of which were announced in May 2019. Following the success of this application, TIAS employed a temporary Research Fellow, Dr Kimi Kärki, to work on the strategic development of TIAS's SAR work. This included the production of a SAR Handbook which is being disseminated to members of SAR Finland. TIAS plans to develop further links with the SAR network in future years, a process which will be assisted by the fact that the University of Turku is the current co-chair of the Finnish chapter of SAR for 2020-21.
